Baking With Emmet CHOCOLATE CHIP COOKIES



Ingredients:

- 1 cup (2 sticks) unsalted butter, softened
- 1 cup white sugar
- 1 cup brown sugar, packed
- 2 eggs
- 2 tsp vanilla extract
- 1 tsp baking soda
- 2 tsp hot water
- 1/2 tsp salt
- 3 cups all-purpose flour
 2 cups semisweet chocolate chips

Instructions:

- Preheat oven to 350 degrees
- Using a mixer or by hand, cream together butter, white sugar, and brown sugar until smooth and fluffy
- Beat in the eggs one at a time, and then stir in the vanilla
- Dissolve the baking soda in the hot water, and add in along with the salt
- Gently stir in the flour by the cup
- Bake by large spoonfuls on ungreased baking sheets until edges are nicely browned, about 10 minutes
